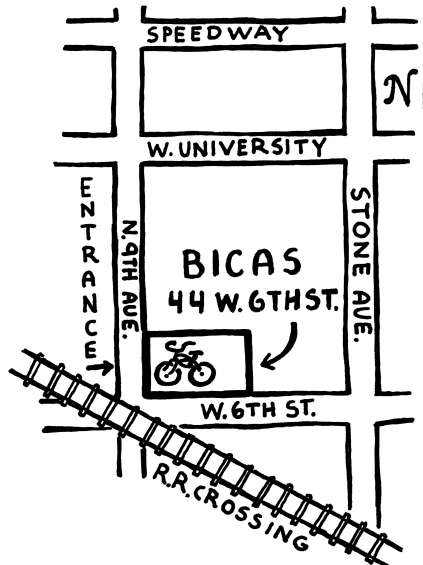
Want to help out BICAS? There are a number of ways you can help BICAS continue to provide important services to the community.

**THE COMMUNITY TOOLS PROGRAM** provides the perfect medium to educate the public on the maintenance and safe use of their bicycles. BICAS supplies a fully equipped community tool shop for all your bike maintenance needs.

Shop time costs \$4 an hour, but never more than \$12 a day.



Beautiful pieces of art created at BICAS can be found throughout the city in the form of artistic bicycle racks and trash containers, around the BICAS building and courtyard, or in the form of fashion accessories worn by folks around town.

## COMMUNITY

You can fix your bike at BICAS by using our tools and choosing from our selection of used parts. And don't worry, we will be there to help you along the way!



### ASK ABOUT OUR WORK-TRADE PROGRAM.

You can help keep the collective running and earn enough credit for a used bike plus shop time to fix it up. Work-Trade credit is worth \$8 an hour in shop credit.

BICAS also organizes monthly community bike rides and bike-in movies with free popcorn! Check our on-line calendar for dates and details.

## EDUCATION

BICAS holds workshops to teach the community how to safely and effectively maintain, rebuild, and ride bicycles. Check our on-line calendar or ask a staff member about upcoming classes.

**BUILD-A-BIKE WORKSHOPS** are designed to teach you how to properly and completely rebuild a bicycle. Over the course of 8 weeks you and a partner will completely dismantle a bicycle then learn how to build it back up from scratch! At the end of the course you will receive \$40 in Community Tools credit to rebuild a bike of your own.

**BASIC MAINTENANCE WORKSHOPS** are held the first and third Wednesdays of every month from 4 - 7 p.m. and are \$20 per person. No need to pre-register, just bring your bike to BICAS the day of the class. For more information, email [education@bicas.org](mailto:education@bicas.org).

## ART

We maintain a small art gallery inside BICAS. A much larger selection is available at our annual art auction (in late Fall).

**BICAS HOSTS FREE COMMUNITY ART WORKSHOPS** every Friday afternoon from 4 - 7pm. BICAS also does art education outreach at our community center and in schools across Tucson.
